



AZRivers – RRE Basic Plan of Events Workshop and Field Experiences

Welcome to the Arizona Rivers Riparian Research Experience! We look forward to meeting you in June. As you may know, the main focus of our Southwestern Academy training on June 6-8 is to prepare a small group of high school students and their mentors/teachers for the Riparian Research Experience (RRE), which will continue on through June 20th and over the succeeding school year. That said, we are also looking forward to having several teachers and science collaborators there for the whole 3-day workshop to explore how they can get their students involved in local riparian research projects. - 16 Travel to Southwestern Academy – tour Montezuma’s Castle and work on Presentations & Research Projects
- 17 Oak Creek Canyon & Slide Rock SP. Work on Presentations & Research Projects
- 18 Tuzigoot NM and Verde River headwaters. Work on Presentations & Research Projects
